Special Services and Events

Favourite Hymns Service

Children's Day

Children's Day on 18th June 2006 was based on the family and gave an emphasis on fathers, as it was also coincidentally Father's Day.

Vanessa Surgeonor led the service and the Rt Rev Campbell gave the Children's Sermon and presented the many prizes to our children.

We would wish to thank all those who help in our Sunday School especially our Superintendent Mrs Jacqueline Crooks who teaches by example in her kindness and giving and sharing of her time and wisdom. Also Mrs Ethel Logan who brings out the best of the children's musical talents.

Although the numbers in the Sunday school are small, we teachers appreciate that they are the Church's future and it is wonderful to see the children returning each September, perhaps bringing friends or younger family members with them and feeling that they belong here.

Harvest Thanksgiving

The Harvest Service was held on Sunday 8 October 2006 and the Rt Rev. Campbell led the worship amid a beautiful array of flowers, vegetables and fruit. The colour and scents were wonderful and gave testimony to the hard work and commitment of the ladies of the congregation. The adult choir began the service with a lovely piece "Take my life and let it be" and their renditions of "Lord, bless and pity us" and "Labour on" were no less inspiring. The Festive Season

It is now planned that work will commence within a very short time to install a new staircase, re-position the dumb-waiter, re-design the kitchen and provide a Minister's room within the existing layout.

Ballyclare Area

The Rt Rev Colin Campbell attends regular meetings for the Ministers of the Ballyclare area which have resulted in increased awareness of our neighbouring churches. Also, at Christmas approximately twenty-two of these ministers, including Rt Rev Colin Campbell, sat out for the "Black Santa Appeal" in Belfast.

Sometimes we may take the facilities and services of our church for granted. So may I take this opportunity to thank all those who selflessly give up their time to help make the church a Community as much as a building.
